
Mustang Cobra Style Rear Spoiler (94-98) - Installation Instructions




Please read through the instructions carefully before starting this project. Take the time to get all the materials together as well as all the safety equipment.

Tools Needed:

- Electric Drill.
- Pilot Drill Bit 3/32" (2mm).
- 9/32" (6.5mm) Drill Bit.
- Pozidrive (X-Point) Screwdriver.
- Masking Tape.
- Small quantity of Rust Inhibiting Primer.
- Felt Tip Pen.

Included Parts

- One Piece Spoiler.
- Set of M6 Screws and Washer.
- Set of Plastic Locator Strips.
- 3 pieces Cable Ties.
- 2 Scotchlocks.



Installation:

- 1. Clean the Boot Lid/Tailgate and dry it thoroughly.
- 2. Offer up the Spoiler and find the most suitable location. Stand back and view the car from all angles to satisfy yourself of its fitness and suitability (see illustration 1).
- 3. To make sure that the end features of the Spoiler are clear of the bodywork by a minimum of 5/32"(4mm) and that the Spoiler will not foul Radio/Telephone Aerial if fitted. It is necessary to relocate the aerial if this occurs.
- 4. When Completely satisfied with the positioning of the Spoiler, mark its position on the Boot Lid/Tailgate using a Felt Tip Pen: Check from below to ensure that the fixing holes will clear any obstruction (see illustration 2).
- 5. Insert a Plastic Locator Strip into each of the 5 holes. A small piece of Masking Tape will help to hold it temporarily into place. The Tabs should be parallel to the Spoiler (see illustration 3).
- 6. Tape down the Tabs on the locator strips using Masking Tape (see illustration 4).

- 7. Carefully remove the Spoiler leaving the Locator strips in position.
- 8. Drill a 3/32" (2mm) Pilot Hole through the centre hole of the Locator into Boot Lid/tailgate (see illustration 5). Drill an appropriate hole for the LED light wire.
- 9. Remove the Locator Strips and open up the holes using 9/32" (6.5mm) Drill Bit.
- 10. Avoid over tightening the fixing Screws, particularly if they bridge a hollow Double Skin.
- 11. Treat all holes with Rust Inhibiting Fluid/Silicone.
- 12. The Spoiler must not be used as handle for opening and closing the Boot Lid/tailgate.

Painting Instructions

- 1. You can use any paint for topcoat Spraying but recommended paint is 2K.
- 2. Prior rubbing before spraying is very important. It is advisable to test a small sample of paint on the underside of the Spoiler to satisfy that good adhesion can be obtained and that there is no attack on the Spoiler.
- 3. It is strongly recommended that a qualified car painter should be consulted before spraying.
